Every year on November 11 in the francophone country of Belgium, the Belgian people celebrate Armistice Day. Similar to our Veterans Day, this holiday commemorates the end of World War I. This year will be the 104th anniversary of Armistice Day. The day is observed quite similarly to Veterans Day in that people use the day to reflect on those who gave their lives for their country. Many use the day to visit memorials or parades. The city of Ypres, where one of World War I's most deadly battles was fought, is the home of the Menin Gate Memorial, where the Last Post, a bugle call that signifies the end of the day, rings out through the silent crowd. The holiday marks an important time in our world's history.

- ...the French city of Toulouse (home of our pen pals) is one of the world's leading cities in aerospace technology?


